## ETHNO-CULTURAL PROCESSES IN UPPER DON REGION IN SARMATIAN TIME (2<sup>ND</sup> CENTURY BC - 3<sup>RD</sup> CENTURY AD)

The article analyzes three chronological groups of Sarmatian time sites in forest-steppe Don region. Based on their study, it is possible to define how far the Sarmatians spread to the North along the banks of Tanais-Don, which is up to northern areas of present-day Lipetsk oblast. It is also possible to reveal a complex process of Sarmatian culture transformation as a result of its adaptation to natural environment of the forest-steppe and growing contacts with settled forest-steppe population. Therefore it is concluded that these processes in Upper Don region in  $2^{nd}$  -  $3^{rd}$  centuries AD led to formation of a new ancient ethnos, represented by the culture of Upper Don burial sites.
