PLAY ON WORDS AND MORPHEMIC REPETITION: DIFFERENT MEANINGS OF MORPHEMICALLY RELATED WORDS AS CONTESTANTS OF A COMIC CONTROVERSY

The article considers interrelation of such syntagmatic phenomena as play on words and morphemic repetition in English artistic prose. Linguistic interplay is based on divisibility of a word with a morphemically complex structure. Different meanings of a structurally divisible word function as contestants of a comic controversy with no preference given to either participant in the interplay.
